Embedded browser for verticals, TV, game consoles and IP solutions.







* OBML: Opera Binary Markup Language - a compressed, binary representation of the page rendered by Mini Server

General Commercial Models...

Option 1: A Royalty free Generic version of Opera Mini can be distributed by selected partners



- Opera provides license-free Hosted download server and proxy solution
- Partner provides marketing and device pre-installation

Price: Distributor only pays yearly Support & Maintenance

Option 2: Partners licenses a Custom or Branded versions of the application and promote their own services



Opera offers:

- Hosted server solution
- Client customization & branding services
- Support & Maintenance

Price: Dependant on volumes and level of customization






